

2025 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

The Utah Education Association (UEA) tracked numerous bills during the 2025 legislative session. This summary highlights several bills that could have an impact on public education and educators. It is important to note that a voting record is only one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators.

HOUSE BILLS

UEA's Position: Oppose

HB 267 sub 1 (Rep. J. Teuscher) Public Sector Labor Union Amendments **Passed the House and the Senate**

Prohibits a public employer from recognizing a bargaining agent or collectively bargaining with a labor organization, including those representing educators. Requires labor organizations collecting member dues via payroll deduction to annually report to the state the amount the organization spent representing members in disputes, lobbying, political activities and giving to affiliate organizations as well as membership numbers. Requires UEA and local affiliates withdraw from participation in the Utah Retirement System by July 1, 2027, and allows employees on staff prior to the withdrawal date to remain in the URS. Requires the state Risk Manager to offer an option for K-12 employees to purchase professional liability insurance.

HB 77 Sub 1 (Rep. T. Lee)

UEA's Position: Oppose

Flag Display Amendments

Passed the House and the Senate

Prohibits the display of any flag in schools or on government property except for those included in a list of about a dozen approved flags. The impact will be to prohibit the display of pride flags in schools. Schools would have 30 days to address an alleged violation after which a \$500 fine may be imposed.

HB 100 Sub 3 (Rep. T. Clancy)

Food Security Amendments

UEA's Position: Support Passed the House and the Senate Expands free lunch to K-12 students currently qualifying for reduced-price meals.

HB 204 (Rep. K. Peterson)

UEA's Position: Support

Stipends for Future Educators Grant Program Amendments Passed the House and the Senate

Amends the grant program to qualify more student teachers and adds the program to the public education economic stabilization restricted account so that future funding is prioritized.



2025 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

HB 281 Sub 3 (Rep. S. Gricius)

UEA's Position: Oppose

Health Curriculum and Procedures Amendments Passed the House and the Senate

Requires obtaining written parental consent before a public school can provide mental health services to a student. Consent must include a statement that school "personnel will adhere to the topics or issues the parent identifies, in collaboration with authorized personnel, for discussion or exclusion with the student" with exceptions provided for topics that would compromise the student's immediate safety or violate mandatory reporting obligations. Also amends provisions regarding health curriculum to include instruction on the "success sequence".

SB 37 (Sen. L. Fillmore) *UEA's Position: Oppose*

Minimum Basic Tax Rate Amendments Passed the House and the Senate

Requires a school district to remit minimum basic rate property taxes to the state General Fund. Within 35 days the State Board is required to return an equivalent amount of money to the school district. The result is to redirect \$842.1 million from property taxes to the General Fund.
