UEA 2018 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

The Utah Education Association tracked numerous bills during the 2018 legislative session. This summary highlights several bills dealing directly or indirectly with education that were voted on by the Legislature that could have a significant impact on public education and/or the UEA. It is important to note that a voting record is but one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators.

From bills affecting public education funding and education governance to restorative practices and teacher salary supplements, lawmakers considered a wide variety of education-related measures during their 45-day session. In addition to using floor votes on bills, we have included a few committee and amended votes as well. Often these votes provide a more accurate indication of a legislator's support or lack thereof. The UEA encourages you to contact your legislators directly to ask them to explain their votes. HOUSE VOTE BILLS

HB 57 (John Westwood)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 57 enacts a state earned income tax credit.

UTAH INTERGENERATIONAL POVERTY WORK
AND SELF-SUFFICIENCY TAX CREDIT

Passed in the House and Senate/Filed.

HB 68 (Justin Fawson)

UEA's Position: Oppose

HB 68 requires candidates to choose to seek a party nomination through the convention process or the signature-gathering process, but not both.

POLITICAL PARTY AMENDMENTS

Failed in the House.

HB 132 S3 (Lowry Snow)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 132 S3 clarifies the duties of school resource officers and examines reasons students are referred to the juvenile system for truancy.

JUVENILE JUSTICE MODIFICATIONS

Passed in the House and Senate.

HB 175 S3 (Keven Stratton)

UEA's Position: Oppose

HB 175 S3 creates an oversight committee to oversee governmental entities with the ability to "initiate a committee study, investigate or audit."

LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT AMENDMENTS

Passed in the House and not heard in the Senate.

HB 233 S1 (Val Potter)

UEA's Position: Oppose Sub 1

HB 233 S1 removes the teacher salary supplement from compensation calculations for retirement purposes and requires districts to provide matching funding.

TEACHER SALARY SUPPLEMENT REVISIONS

Passed in the House and House and Senate Ed Committees.

HB 264 (Steve Eliason)

UEA's Position: Support w/Comment

HB 264 creates a grant program for low-income elementary schools to hire a counselor or social worker for school-based mental health supports.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL COUNSELOR PROGRAM

Passed in the House and Senate.

HOUSE VOTE BILLS, CONTINUED

HB 293 S1 & S4 (Brad Last)

UEA's Position: Support

EDUCATION FUNDING AMENDMENTS

Passed in the House and House Ed Committee and the Senate.

HB 293 S1 and S4 equalizes property tax funding for schools using new property tax revenue and adds a new increment on the basic rate indexed to the WPU.

HB 313 S1 (Dan McCay)

UEA's Position: Oppose

PUBLIC SCHOOL REVISIONS

Passed in the House and Senate.

HB 313 S1 allows charter school authorizers to finalize school approvals, removing the elected State Board of Education from the approval process.

HJR 20 S1 (Becky Edwards)

UEA's Position: Support

JOINT RESOLUTION SUBMITTING A QUESTION TO VOTERS

Passed in the House and Senate.

HJR 20 S1 places a question on the November 2018 ballot asking voters if they support a ten cent per gallon gas tax to provide for new education funding.

HR 1 S1 (Sandra Hollins)

UEA's Position: Support

RESOLUTION URGING RESTORATIVE JUSTICE IN UTAH'S EDUCATION SYSTEM

Passed in the House with no other vote needed.

HR 1 S1 urges the use of restorative justice for disciplinary problems in Utah's education system.

SB 194 S1 (Ann Millner)

UEA's Position: Support

EARLY LITERACY PROGRAM

Passed in the House and the Senate.

SB 194 S1 renames K-3 Reading Program and requires USBE to provide supports if a school does not reach early literacy goals.

SJR 16 S1 (Jim Dabakis)

UEA's Position: Oppose

PROPOSAL TO AMEND CONSTITUTION – PUBLIC EDUCATION GOVERNANCE

Passed in the Senate. Failed in the House.

SJR 16 S1 replaces the State Board of Education with a board appointed by the Governor and approved by the Senate.
