UEA 2019 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

The Utah Education Association tracked numerous bills during the 2019 legislative session. This summary highlights several bills dealing directly or indirectly with education, voted on by members of the legislature that could have a significant impact on public education and/or the UEA. It is important to note that a voting record is but one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators.

From public education funding and tax reform policy bills to addressing Utah's teacher shortage and student and school health and safety issues, lawmakers considered a wide variety of education-related measures during their 45-day session. In addition to using floor votes on bills, included are two committee votes as well. Often these votes provide a more accurate indication of a legislator's support or lack thereof. The UEA encourages you to contact your legislators directly to ask them to explain their votes. HOUSE VOTE BILLS

HB 118 (Mike Winder)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 118 allows teachers to use statewide standardized tests to improve a student's academic grade.

INCENTIVES FOR STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT PERFORMANCE

Passed in the House and Senate.

HB 120 (Ray Ward)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 120 directs USBE to develop model policies and procedures for threat assessment and creates a 'school safety center' to coordinate training.

STUDENT AND SCHOOL SAFETY ASSESSMENT

Passed in the House and Senate.

HB 130 (Carol Moss)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 130 directs the Utah State Board of Education to create standards for an educator's exit survey when a teacher leaves employment.

PUBLIC EDUCATION EXIT SURVEY

Passed in the House and Senate.

HB 188 (Lowry Snow)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 188 changes the T.H. Bell Program for education students from a loan forgiveness program to a scholarship program.

T.H. BELL PROGRAM AMENDMENTS

Passed in the House and Senate.

HB 198 (Marie Poulson)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 198 removes the requirement for the State Board of Education to use a single letter grade when assigning a school an overall rating.

EDUCATION ACCOUNTABILITY AMENDMENTS

Passed in the House but not heard in the Senate.

HB 373 (Steve Eliason)

UEA's Position: Support

HB 373 provides matching grant funds to hire school counselors, psychologists, social workers and nurses.

STUDENT SUPPORT AMENDMENTS

Passed in the House and Senate.
