# UEA 2022 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

The Utah Education Association tracked numerous bills during the 2022 legislative session. This summary highlights several bills dealing directly or indirectly with education, voted on by members of the legislature, that could have a significant impact on public education and/or the UEA. It is important to note that a voting record is but one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators.

From school safety amendments and paid professional hours for educators to public educator curriculum transparency and a new private and home school voucher program, lawmakers considered a wide variety of education-related measures during the 45-day session.

## HOUSE VOTE BILLS

### **HB 11 S4 (Kera Birkeland)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

Bars transgender girls from competing in interscholastic sports matching their gender identities.

### STUDENT ELIGIBILITY IN INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

*Passed in the House and in the Senate.*

### **HB 113 S1 (Marsha Judkins)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Amends a formula for special education funding.

### STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES FUNDING REVISIONS

*Passed in the House and in the Senate.*

### **HB 331 S5 (Candice Pierucci)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

Establishes a voucher program to pay for private education goods and services using taxpayer dollars.

### HOPE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

*Failed in the House.*

### **HB 366 S1 (Keven Stratton)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

Amends provisions regarding curriculum transparency.

### EDUCATION TRANSPARENCY

*Failed in the House Education Committee.*

### **HB 396 S1 (Jefferson Moss)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Allocates \$64 million for licensed educators to receive flexible, educator-directed paid time for job-related duties outside contract time.

### PAID PROFESSIONAL HOURS FOR EDUCATORS

*Passed in the House and in the Senate.*

### **HB 428 S2 (Sandra Hollins)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Requires the State Board to provide training and school districts to adopt a plan for harassment and discrimination-free learning.

### SCHOOL SAFETY AMENDMENTS

*Passed in the House and the Senate.*
