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# UEA 2021 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

The Utah Education Association tracked numerous bills during the 2021 legislative session. This summary highlights several bills dealing directly or indirectly with education, voted on by members of the legislature, that could have a significant impact on public education and/or the UEA. It is important to note that a voting record is but one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators.

From school accountability amendments and in-person instruction prioritization to an educator scholarship program and educator hearings amendments (UEA brought this issue to the legislature), lawmakers considered a wide variety of education-related measures during the 45-day session.

## HOUSE VOTE BILLS

### **HB 93 S2 (Brian King)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Amends several provisions related to the purposes for youth suicide prevention programs.

YOUTH SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAMS AMENDMENTS

*Passed in the House and in the Senate.*

### **HB 105 (Marsha Judkins)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Amends a formula related to add-on weighted pupil units for students with disabilities.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES AMENDMENTS

*Passed in the House and the Senate but not funded.*

### **HB 182 S2 (Craig Hall)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Clarifies existing statute to identify the appropriate court for an educator who appeals a termination. UEA brought this issue to the legislature.

EDUCATOR HEARINGS AMENDMENTS

*Passed in the House and in the Senate.*

### **HB 302 S2 (Kera Birkeland)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose w/Comments*

Requires schools to designate athletic activities as "boys", "girls" or "coed" and prohibits male students at birth from participating in girls' sports.

PRESERVING SPORTS FOR FEMALE STUDENTS

*Passed in the House but held in the Senate.*

### **HB 340 (Steve Eliason)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Reinstates the Math and Science Opportunities for Students and Teachers (MOST) Program cut in a 2020 special legislative session.

MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS AND TEACHERS PROGRAM

*Passed in the House but not heard in the Senate.*

### **HB 381 S1 (Jefferson Moss)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Creates a scholarship for paraprofessionals and school counselor interns to become licensed teachers or licensed school counselors.

GROW YOUR OWN TEACHER AND SCHOOL COUNSELOR PIPELINE PROGRAM

*Passed in the House and in the Senate.*

### **HB 421 S3 (Marsha Judkins)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

Creates the Intensive Services Special Education Pilot Program to provide funding to local education agencies to supplement the cost of educating a student with intensive special education needs.

INTENSIVE SERVICES PILOT PROGRAM

*Passed in the House and in the Senate.*

# UEA 2021 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

## HOUSE VOTE BILLS, CONTINUED

### **HB 428 S2 (Steve Waldrip)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

Creates a Public Education Appeals Panel to review local school board decisions and policies.

### **PUBLIC EDUCATION GOVERNANCE AND APPEALS**

*Passed House Committee but not heard in the Senate.*

### **SB 107 S7 (Todd Weiler)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

Implements thresholds and requirements for the test-to-stay testing program that go into effect if two percent of the school population tests positive for Covid-19. Also requires all school districts to offer in-person learning a minimum four days a week as an option for students.

### **IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION PRIORITIZATION**

*Passed in the House and the Senate.*
