

# UEA-Retired Pat Rusk Legacy Scholarship Information for University Senior Education Students

Pat Rusk was a former Utah Education Association President. She also served as UEA Vice President and as the Eastern Utah UniServ Director. Pat served as the Executive Director of the UEA Children at Risk Foundation. A long-time teacher in both Wyoming and Utah, Pat was involved anywhere she could advocate for students, teachers and public education. She served in the Association as a local association representative and all the way to being elected President of UEA. Pat served on numerous committees at the local, state and national level. She received the Charles E. Bennett Human and Civil Rights Award for creating and managing the A+ Tutoring program. She expanded her work by serving on the Advisory Boards of the Utah Retirement System, the National Council for Communities and Justice, KUED, the 3 R's Project and the Governor's Commission on Literacy. In addition, she served in leadership roles for Job's Daughters, the NAACP and the Inclusion Center for Community and Justice. Pat received the Humanitarian of the Year Award from the Inclusion Center. Pat's legacy is in her lifetime of leadership and service.

- Personal essay of up to 200 words as to why you want to be a teacher and how you would use the Scholarship money,
- One (1) letter of recommendation from a college faculty member.
